### Learning this term:

This term our topic is WW2, focussing on the lives of children, abroad as well as at home, in this era. To develop this topic further, all our literacy will be linked to WW2. If you have any books or find anything interesting then please do send them in for us to share.

In Science we will be studying Scientists and Inventors, linked to WW2, for the first half term. The second half will be looking at Light

Maths in the Autumn term looks mainly at place value so that we get a good basis from which to tackle all the other areas. We will be working hard on our problem solving and reasoning.

**PE** and Music continue to be on a Wednesday, please can your child come to school dressed in PE kit. The PE kit is black shirt/skort, white t-shirt, grey/black/navy tracksuit or jogging bottoms and school sweatshirt. Children will need outdoor trainers and indoor daps/pumps.

Outdoor Learning – This will take place on a Thursday afternoon so please can children come to school suitably dressed, particularly as the weather begins to change.

### Homework Expectations:

In Y5/6 children are expected to read 4 x a week at home. This will be backed up in class as well.

Every Friday Spellings will be given out and placed on SeeSaw and the previous weeks tested. It is always really helpful if children get the chance to practise learning their spellings at home with an adult if possible.

Also on a Friday I will set a short maths/English or topic homework. Children will have until the following Friday to complete this and bring it back in.
