We have become aware that an increasing number of toys from home are being brought into school particularly by some of the younger pupils. We are asking parents/carers if you could please help us by persuading your children to leave their toys at home as it can lead to problems in school. Unfortunately precious items from home can occasionally get damaged or lost if they come to school and this can cause unnecessary upset and difficulties.

## Healthy eating

The school has in the past been keen to promote healthy eating and healthy lifestyle choices however this has not been very clear recently. We will be encouraging pupils with healthy choices in school and would ask for your help in reinforcing these ideas at home and through the snacks and lunchboxes children bring into school. We do not advocate the 'banning' of particular items but do ask that sweets are not brought into school. Break time snacks such as fruit and cereal bars rather than chocolate and crisps will be encouraged as well as healthy choices for lunchboxes with occasional rather than daily treats. We hope that you can understand our reasons for this.
