There were 16 children in this particular year group, including 1 child who did not take Key Stage 1 assessments because they were not at school in England at the time. This means that data for this child cannot be included in the progress figures below.

In summary:

75% of our pupils achieved level 4 or more in reading, writing and maths.

94% (15/16) of our pupils achieved level 4 or above in reading.

50% (8/16) of our pupils achieved level 5 in reading.

94% (15/16) of our pupils achieved level 4 or above in writing.

31% (5/16) of our pupils achieved level 5 in writing.

81 % (13/16) of our pupils achieved level 4 or above in maths.

38% (6/16) of our pupils achieved level 5 or above in maths

6% (1/16) of our pupils achieved level 6 in maths.

93% (15/16) of our pupils made expected progress (at least 2 levels) in reading.

40% (6/16) of our pupils made better than expected progress (3 levels) in reading.

93% (15/16) of our pupils made expected progress (at least 2 levels) in writing.

40% (6/16) of our pupils made better than expected progress (3 levels) in writing

80% (13/16) of our pupils made expected progress (at least 2 levels) in maths.

20% (3/16) of our pupils made better than expected progress (3 levels) in maths

Compared to previous years, this shows a maintenance in high standards in Reading and a considerable improvement in attainment and progress with Writing. Improving progress in maths will be part of the new School Improvement Plan, especially for higher achieving students and those who were slightly below average at Key Stage 1.
