# Covid-19 Updates

Thank you to all families for your continued support during these challenging times. Regular testing at home (using lateral flows) is really helping us identify the spread of infection. If you are able, it really helps if you can continue to test the children in the case of a close contact or an outbreak in a class

From 23<sup>rd</sup> February, the Government changed their Covid-19 guidance for schools. As a school, we have decided the following:

- Test your child (if you are able to) when they are displaying symptoms or they have been in close contact with another confirmed case.
- Children that have tested positive should isolate for up to 10 days.
- If a child tests negative on two consecutive days from day 5 onwards (ie days 5 and 6 or days 6 and 7 etc), they will be able to return to school.

Thank you for your support with our most recent rise in cases in Otter class. It is never an easy decision to have to close a class, but we believe it will help to reduce the infection rate across the school.

Unless you have already done so, please can you inform the school if your child has either been ill or tested positive during the time they have not been in school due to the closure of Otter and Badger class.
